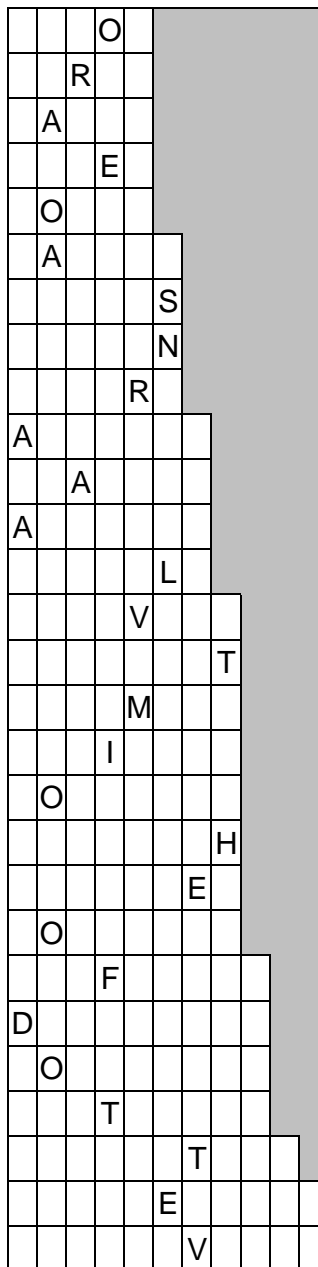


PHILOSOPHERS!
